

Who can apply?

Any individual, voluntary organisation, charity or community based organisation which operates on a not for profit basis, is open to the general public and is providing services or facilities for the benefit of residents in Chiltern District.

How much is available?

The maximum pledge award available is 50% of the total project cost, up to £5,000.

When will the pledge be released?

Chiltern District Council will release the allocated pledge once the project has reached their fundraising target.

When does the scheme end?

Project will be funded on a first come first served basis. Once the fund has run out no more pledges will be made. Projects will not be accepted after 1st January 2020.

When do projects have to finish crowdfunding by?

29th February 2020

Where does the project have to be delivered?

The project must take place within the Chiltern District Council boundaries.

When does the project have to be delivered by?

March 2021
