Neighbourhood Priorities

The priorities for your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NHPT) will be decided by the Policing Issues Panel; comprised of representatives from Community Boards from the whole of South Buckinghamshire. The Police do not run the panel, although we do attend as representatives. This allows us to speak to a wide cross-section of the community, find out what you most want improved in the area and consider how we and others can accomplish these aims. The top three priorities are chosen by the forum every three months and are then assumed by your Neighbourhood Policing Team. Priority – Burglary

This quarter we have seen a reduction in burglaries this quarter with only 6 so far this year which is a reduction from 20 last quarter.

In addition we also run a proactive operation which specifically floods rural and cross border areas of the LPA with proactive patrols during peak offending times. This has helped us to detect crime and apprehend cross border offenders who use arterial routes to enter our policing area and to protect residents living within South Buckinghamshire.

This quarter we have seen some amazing results with

- 5 Arrests
- 7 Vehicles seized
- 2 Stolen Vehicles recovered



Now that the warmer weather is upon us and residents are starting to travel again please remember to

- Cut back your shrubs and hedges to aid visibility
- Set timer switches to turn your lights on when away
- Avoid leaving valuables in plain view e.g. laptops and tablets
- Set any house alarms
- Lock side gates to prevent access to the rear of your property
- Keep any tools and ladders stored safely away in a locked garage
- Don't advertise that you are away and that your home is empty, by 'checking in' or posting your holiday snaps on social media
- Resist uploading any holiday pictures to social media until you have returned home
- Don't leave windows open at the front of your property when you are in the garden

Priority – Anti-Social Behaviour

We have identified issues around Malthouse Square and Holtspur Park in relation to antisocial behaviour and drug use and an increase in Graffiti. To combat this there has been increased patrols in the area at peak times.

In addition PCSO Hawkes is working closely with the Beaconsfield School to run a youth project over the half term period. This is a music and film project to encourage local youths to get involved and learn new skills. This is aimed at youths between 11-14 year olds and gives them opportunities to learn about making films, how to produce and edit them and work alongside a music/song producer and film maker from the Song Corporation, London. This is the fourth project of this type which has always been a great hit with the local kids!

Priority – Speeding

This quarter we had a slight delay in doing monthly speed enforcement as we were awaiting our new Bushnell speed guns. These have now arrived which means the team will be able to carry out speeding operations at the following locations during the next quarter on the Amersham Road. A40 and Candlemas Lane.

In addition we have Community Speed Watch team, this is a great opportunity for residents who wish to volunteer their time to monitor speeding in areas highlighted for concern by fellow residents. Other News

During this quarter the team have been carrying out park sweeps with the Community Safety team and conducting talks at schools to raise awareness around Knife Crime.

During June the NH teams have been working closely with Immigration visiting various car washes around the area promoting the Responsible Car Wash Scheme. To level the playing field for operators enabling them to compete on an equal footing with their competitors

- To educate operators on the regulations that apply and to ensure that they comply with them
- To be a positive force in improving conditions for workers; upholding their statutory rights and protecting them from exploitative work practices
- To protect the environment and the consumer

This has resulted in several locations being identified as employing illegal workers and further work to be carried out by Immigration officers. If you have any concerns there is a safer car wash app that you can download to your smartphone where you can complete a short survey with your concerns

Jubilee Celebrations

The NH teams attended numerous Jubilee Celebrations over the bank holiday weekend providing support and reassurance patrols to our local communities. This also gave us an opportunity to provide crime reduction and let our younger members of the community the chance to look at a police car.
