Neighbourhood Priorities

The priorities for your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NHPT) will be decided by the Policing Issues Panel; comprised of representatives from Community Boards from the whole of Chiltern & South Bucks. The panel is not run by the Police, although we do attend as representatives. This allows us to speak to a wide cross-section of the community, find out what you most want improved in the area and consider how we and others can accomplish these aims. The top three priorities are chosen by the forum every three months and are then assumed by your Neighbourhood Policing Team.

Priority – Burglary

This quarter we have seen a reduction in burglaries this quarter with only 12 so far this year which is a slight increase from last quarter. .

Now that the warmer weather is upon us and residents are starting to travel again please remember to

- Cut back your shrubs and hedges to aid visibility
- Set timer switches to turn your lights on when away
- Avoid leaving valuables in plain view e.g. laptops and tablets
- Set any house alarms
- Lock side gates to prevent access to the rear of your property
- Keep any tools and ladders stored safely away in a locked garage
- Don't advertise that you are away and that your home is empty, by 'checking in' or posting your holiday snaps on social media
- Resist uploading any holiday pictures to social media until you have returned home
- Don't leave windows open at the front of your property when you are in the garden

Priority – Anti-Social Behaviour

We have not seen an appreciable level of anti-social behaviour this quarter and we believe that the higher visibility process that we adopted last year is proving to be effective.

Recently, our attention has been directed towards the recreation grounds in Iver, Iver Heath and Stoke Poges as these areas seem to be attracting undesirable elements, as we seasonally expect. You can help us by reporting issues to us on web forms, or via 101.

We have targeted our patrols still around the Iver Heath area maintaining pressure on the aggressive beggars we have identified and issued out further Antisocial behaviour contracts to manage them. We have also maintained patrols through the alley ways due to reported drugs misuse, our presence and use on social media seems to have disrupted some offenders seeing a decrease in used needles and fewer reports in the areas

Priority – Speeding

Speeding has been an area of concern to many residents within the community but, with the slight increase in traffic gradually taking effect, the number of complaints has reduced.

To support this, we are training more officers to conduct speed measurement; using enforcement devices. We are reviewing the information we are getting from these operations and using this data to guide future deployments. We work very closely with our Roads Policing Dept. and work with them when operational demand allows.

The team have also continued to maintain our high visibility proactive work around road safety reporting a large number of offenders for various road traffic related offences and seized numerous vehicles

Other News

This quarter the team have been out and about with the Community Safety team carrying out park sweeps and conducting talks at schools to raise awareness around Knife Crime.

During June the NH teams have been out and about with Immigration visiting various car washes around the area promoting the Responsible Car Wash Scheme. To level the playing field for operators enabling them to compete on an equal footing with their competitors

- To educate operators on the regulations that apply and to ensure that they comply with them
- To be a positive force in improving conditions for workers; upholding their statutory rights and protecting them from exploitative work practices
- To protect the environment and the consumer



This has resulted in several locations being identified as employing illegal workers and further work to be carried out by Immigration officers. If you have any concerns there is a safer car wash app that you can download to your smartphone where you can complete a short survey with your concerns.

In April, after initially failing to stop for Neighbourhood officers in Iver a Blue Volvo XC60 was located in Hedgerley and confirmed to be an outstanding SMV on false plates, enquiries located an outstanding male who was located and arrested for a number of offences including those relating to the stolen vehicle, Burglary and assaulting an emergency worker. A female was also located and arrested for handling stolen goods.

Last month, following a report of three suspicious males in Iver Heath, Police were called by a vigilant resident, who witnessed the males, the males went on to commit a Burglary to a home address. NHPT Sgt Ryder arrived on scene within 3 minutes of the call along with a roads Policing unit. The offenders failed to stop for the officers and was pushed into Hillingdon where they discarded the vehicle and made off on foot. Sgt Ryder located one of the males and he was arrested and later charged for the Burglary. Enquiries are still ongoing.
