Neighbourhood Priorities

The priorities for your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NHPT) will be decided by the Policing Issues Panel; comprised of representatives from Community Boards in relevant areas. The Police do not run the panel, although we do attend as representatives. This allows us to speak to a wide cross-section of the community, find out what matters most to them and consider how we and others can make improvements. The top three priorities are chosen by the forum every four months, which are then adopted by your Neighbourhood Policing Team. Priority - Burglary

This quarter, we have again seen a reduction in burglaries dropping from 6 to 2, the Neighbourhood Policing team have increased patrols around Burkes Road and Warwick Court and provided residents with crime reduction advice. To continue to combat this nature of offending, we have been carrying out proactive operations which specifically floods rural and cross-border areas of the LPA, with proactive patrols during peak offending times. This has helped us to detect crime and apprehend cross-border offenders who use arterial routes to enter our policing area and to protect residents living within South Buckinghamshire.

Please remember these tips to reduce the risk of becoming a victim of burglary, especially as the nights are now drawing in:

- Cut back your shrubs and hedges to aid visibility
- Set timer switches to turn your lights on when away
- Avoid leaving valuables in plain view e.g. laptops and tablets
- Set any house alarms
- Lock side gates to prevent access to the rear of your property
- Keep any tools and ladders stored safely away in a locked garage

- Don't advertise that you are away and that your home is empty, by 'checking in' or posting your holiday snaps on social media
- Resist uploading any holiday pictures to social media until you have returned home
- Don't leave windows open at the front of your property when you are in the garden

Priority - Anti-Social Behaviour

We have seen a reduction of reports of ASB, drug use and graffiti around Malthouse Square and Holtspur Park. This is due to the large number of high visibility patrols that the team have been carrying out at this location. The team have also been working with the local schools, to try to identify individual "tags" and raising awareness with students.

Priority – Speeding

Speeding is still an issue around Penn Road. Amersham Road. A40 and Candlemas Lane. Due to commitments and staff abstractions over the Summer, we have been unable to carry out any enforcement this quarter but will be picking this up over the coming weeks.

Our Roads Policing have spent 17 hours during June and identified 340 offences across South Bucks and the fixed cameras have identified 55 offenders. During July they spent 22 hours conducting speed enforcement and identified 250 offences and the fixed camera caught 250 offenders. The Roads Policing department hold primacy in delivering speed enforcement, with Neighbourhood Policing seeking to augment this provision, in recognition of local appetite.

In addition, we have the Community Speed Watch team: this is a great opportunity for residents who wish to volunteer their time to monitor speeding in areas highlighted for concern by fellow residents. Our thanks to the school and their students, for the opportunity to work with them.

During this quarter, Beaconsfield Neighbourhood Team were involved in knife testpurchasing, through the Chiltern and South Bucks areas; resulting in one shop in Amersham and another in Chesham being given words of advice.
