

### What is "Neighbourhood Policing"?





#### **Force Performance**

(April – September 2022)

- 497,857 total contacts from the public
- 190,464 calls to 999; 260,270 calls to 101; and 47,123 online reports
- 3,319 missing persons found in three months, 313 deemed 'high risk'
- 90,339 incidents attended
- 15,099 arrests made
- 445 knife crime arrests
- 4,494 domestic abuse arrests
- 319 protests, vigils, and car meets evaluated
- 4,025 road traffic collisions attended
- 6,121 fixed penalty notices issued
- 658 reported crimes of assault against our officers
- 33% decrease in residential burglary (3,412 to 2,280\*\*)
- 21% increase in the volume of crimes resulting in formal action (13,005 to 15,723)\*
- 44% increase in formal action for domestic abuse cases (1,413 to 2,031)\*
- 55% increase in charges for rape, sexual offences and stalking and harassment (464 to 717)
- 173 arrests for making, possessing or distributing indecent images of children
- 74 arrests for either sexual communication with a child 234 arrests for serious organised crime
- 100 adults and children safeguarded from serious organised crime

#### **Recent Crime Trends**

Burglary: local offences have increased by 33%, year on year. Other
police areas experienced an earlier rise: the current level in Chiltern &
South Bucks is now aligned to offending rates in other districts. At
increased risk are affluent areas of rural towns.

Vehicle Crime: local offences have only seen a 7% increase but is one

of the more common victim-based crime.

 Arson: whilst local levels of reported damage have remained relatively constant (0.5% rise), there is a 50% increase in the use of fire, to cause such damage.

## **Ongoing Neighbourhood Issues**

- Operation Gallop refers to pony & trap racing on the A413. Police have achieved successes in diverting these events, but not consistently so. Greater partnership contribution is required to achieve a lasting solution, as reliance on policing provision is unsustainable.
- Operation Go refers to local speed enforcement by Neighbourhood staff; supporting Roads Policing, which is the department who leads on Road Safety issues. Research has indicated that often, residents are principally concerned by the noise of vehicles; travelling at a speed they presume to be excessive. We are therefore also targeting anti-social use of vehicles.
- **Operation Ghostbuster** refers to increased policing presence at ASB 'hotspots', over the Halloween and Fireworks period. This seeks to address misuse of fireworks, graffiti, and other items used to damage.
- Other operations include Op Groundhog (proactive burglary patrols), and Op Greenbelt (rural crime).
