The Police do not run the panel, although we do attend as representatives. This allows us to speak to a wide cross-section of the community, find out what you most want improved in the area and consider how we and others can accomplish these aims. The top three priorities are chosen by the forum every three months and are then assumed by your Neighbourhood Policing Team. Priority – Burglary

We have seen a further reduction in burglaries from 7 to 5 this quarter.



The Neighbourhood team have been carrying out proactive patrols and crime reduction leaflet drops at the following locations: Old Slade Lane, Bangors Road North, Stonecroft Avenue, Dutton Way in Iver.

To continue to combat this we have been carrying out proactive operations which specifically floods rural and cross border areas of the LPA with proactive patrols during peak offending times. This has helped us to detect crime and apprehend cross border offenders who use arterial routes to enter our policing area and to protect residents living within South Buckinghamshire.

Please remember these tips to reduce the risk of becoming a victim of burglary especially as the nights are now drawing in

- Cut back your shrubs and hedges to aid visibility
- Set timer switches to turn your lights on when away
- Avoid leaving valuables in plain view e.g. laptops and tablets
- Set any house alarms
- Lock side gates to prevent access to the rear of your property
- Keep any tools and ladders stored safely away in a locked garage
- Don't advertise that you are away and that your home is empty, by 'checking in' or posting your holiday snaps on social media
- Resist uploading any holiday pictures to social media until you have returned home
- Don't leave windows open at the front of your property when you are in the garden

During this time, although this particular neighbourhood has seen further reductions, nearby neighbourhoods have not been so lucky. During this time of seasonal increase in offences, we urge you all to be extra vigilant: any suspicious activity or persons should be reported to the Police immediately, to increase our chances of apprehending these offenders.

Priority – Anti-Social Behaviour

We have continued to patrol areas subject to Anti-social behaviour. This includes both Iver and Iver Heath recreation grounds, Black Park, Pennyletts Green, George Green Road and Blinco Lane.

Our patrols and prevention work appear to have decreased in the number of reports and issues we have previously seen around the CO-OP store in Iver Heath.

We have also conducted patrols around addresses in George Green and Stoke Poges; following increased reports of ASB.



These patrols assisted us in identifying offending youths which led to the issuing of ASB warning letters and Anti-social behaviour contracts. By involving and informing relevant parents, we have disrupted this behaviour and have seen a decrease of reports, as a result.

Our patrols under this priority are allocated based on the reporting of incidents and it is important that reports are made via Call 101 (Non-Emergency Contact Number) Call 999 in an emergency, only.

During this quarter, we have also run our annual ASB operation to tackle the increase of incidents that occur over Halloween and Bonfire night. We are happy to report that through our early engagement with local groups and individuals, this neighbourhood saw very few reports of ASB over the period

Priority – Speeding

During October our Roads Policing colleagues have spent 15 hours conducting speed enforcement at various locations and out of ten visits identified 587 offences across South Bucks. Our fixed cameras have identified 612 offenders.

In September Neighbourhood attended the following location to carry out speed enforcement.

Stoke Common Road where 96 vehicles passed the check site and 5 were identified driving at a speed, The highest being 39 MPH.

Pinewood Road, where 203 vehicles passed the site and 5 were identified as driving over the 40mph limit. The highest speed recorded was 48MPH.

Bellshill Road, 131 vehicles passed the check site and no offending vehicles.

In November the following roads were attended:

Swallow Street, Iver where 97 vehicles passed the check point and 8 were identified as speeding.

Black Park Road – 73 vehicles passed the site and no offending vehicles

Wexham Street – 103 vehicles passed the site and again no offending vehicles

Other News

We are pleased to announce that PC Dan Brown will be joining the team in January. Dan



has spent several years on Response duties in South Bucks and is looking forward to meeting the community.

In October the PCSOs have been out and about visiting local schools and talking to year six students, raising awareness around about County Drug Lines

During November the team have been carrying out park sweeps with the Community Safety team and conducting talks at schools to raise awareness around Knife Crime.

Officers located a man who was hitting, spitting and swearing at the air. Officers quickly established that the male was having a mental health breakdown. After completing further checks, it was also identified that the male was outstanding as wanted for a Fail to Appear warrant. The male was subsequently arrested and detained under the MH Act, where suitable support was provided.

Another example of the work we do involved enquiries for an elderly lady, who had not been seen for a few days. The officers located the female unconscious at an address, after gaining entry it was established the female had been on the floor for 5 days. Officers provided the necessary First Aid and requested an ambulance: the lady was later taken to Wexham Park Hospital, where she is recovering.

A local car wash has received a further fine of £20000 after a joint NHPT operation with the Immigration service; locating two persons who had illegally entered the UK and working at the establishment.

Offenders Brought to Justice

A male has been given a community resolution for public order in Dutton Way, Iver.

A male has received a community resolution for drug offences

A male and female have been arrested and charged for assault

A male has been arrested and charged for driving offenses in Stoke Poges

A male has received a community resolution for public order in Iver

Three males were arrested and charged for drug offences in Stoke Road.
