



- Survey of residents to establish concerns that they would like to see as focus areas for TVP Neighbourhood Policing teams.
- Analysis of survey and consultation with Community Board Chairs.
- Discussion and questions at meeting, including TVP reports on previous focus areas.
- Focus areas set, communicated to TVP Neighbourhood Teams, become part of their daily routine and reporting plans.
- Emphasis on speedy turnaround and transparency.


The Purpose of this Consultation (2)





Thank you for your comment, but the answer is more nuanced. Most important, the survey and the choices relate solely to the Neighbourhood Policing teams. These are very small teams within (as the name implies) the neighbourhood. Chesham has one Sergeant, 2 PCs and 2 PCSOs. They are just one part of the LPA (Local Policing Area) covering South Buckinghamshire, which has other functional teams, covering Response and Investigation. On the diagram below it explains the Neighbourhood Policing teams' role as a "geographical and problem solviing function with a primary task of demand and vulnerability reduction". Of course, they support the other teams, and vice versa. Elsewhere within Thames valley Police there are specialist teams dealing with national and force policing priorities. Going back to the choices, and understanding the role of the Neighbourhood Police (and their manpower constraints), then we are asking residents what the harms/concerns are that they would like to see prioritised within their daily routines. Naturally, our officers police and respond to crime and harms as they occur, not just those on the list. Much of this expalined on https://www.csb-forum.org/neighbourhoodsurveys/

Engagement – March/April 2023 Survey



- Survey held from 18th March to 2nd April - 582 responses.
- Strong local concerns probably drove highest response numbers from Denham, GX and Chalfonts, and Amersham.
- Population-adjusted engagement highest in Missendens.
- 44 responses from under 18s.
- Distributed via Neighbourhood Alerts, TVP Alerts, social media, direct mailings

Residents' Concerns – Changes to Choices


- Original list drawn up by Chiltern District Council Community Safety team, to gather residents' views on a wider range of concerns.
- Choices rejigged to be more directly relevant to daily policing by our Neighbourhood teams.
- We ask 3 questions:
 - 1 "Would this realistically be a candidate to be included on the Neighbourhood Police officers' daily work schedules?"
 - 2 "Is this category already a national or Force priority?"
 - 3 "Is action on this category primarily the responsibility of another body or agency?"
- For most of the resultant choices, POLICE.UK allows us to track crime stats at a neighbourhood level.
- Participants encouraged to comment in 'Other' box if they have other concerns.

Dropped from Survey:

- Child Sexual Exploitation, Modern Slavery, Cyber Crime and Fraud, Cyber Bullying
- Rural Crime
- Parking, Fly Tipping and Littering,
 Drug and Alcohol Abuse, (earlier) Dog
 Fouling
- Burglary into one category, Knife
 Crime into Weapons Possession


CSB Forum March/April 2023 Survey - Residents' Concerns

 dominant concern, has risen
 sharply as burglary numbers
 have risen
- Next 3 clear of the rest:
 Speeding, Drugs, Antisocial
 Behaviour
- Some strong local concerns, eg pony & trap racing on A413, vehicle crime in Wexham & Iver

- Note very long tail



- Burglary concern top in all but one area.
- **Speeding** still #1 in Missendens, #2 in Beaconsfield, Chesham, Wexham & Ivers.
- Perhaps surprisingly, **Drugs** top 3 in 5 of 7 CB areas, and with Under 18s.
- Antisocial Behaviour likely to increase in summer months.


How do Residents' Concerns match recorded Crime Types?






- Crime data from POLICE.UK, showing share of recorded crime types across Chiltern & S Bucks over past 12 months.
- No data for Speeding and Rogue Traders and Scams, but the latter including online accounts for ~40% of crime nationally.
- Survey data for 'Theft from' and 'Theft of' Vehicles aggregated removing duplications.


Burglaries – January 2020 to February 2023




Reported numbers back to prepandemic levels, thankfully declined since November peak "Now aligned to offending rates in other districts. At increased risk are affluent areas of rural towns."

Burglaries – January 2021 to February 2023






Burglaries – longer term perspective



- Total burglaries 12-month moving average rising for the past 15 months.
- Recent peak November 2022

Drugs – a conundrum



- Strong perception in the survey that Drugs is a problem:
- In top 3 concerns, #2 after
 Burglary in Amersham,
 Beaconsfield, Beeches and with
 U18s, #3 in Chesham, Denham GX
 and Chalfonts
- But relatively low recorded crime: average of 15 per month across
 Chiltern & S Bucks last 12 months.
- Concern that Drugs promote further harms

Speeding

"Whilst speed enforcement is not principally owned by Neighbourhood Policing Team (Roads Policing owns road safety), we do play our part with the deployment of our own approved devices."



Antisocial Behaviour – expecting seasonal pick up?



- Strong seasonal pattern increased ASB in summer months.
- A catch-all category
- Many residents' ASB complaints in Denham GX and Chalfonts reference Pony & Trap Racing on A413
- TVP action on Pony & Trap
 Racing reported in
 newsletters under ASB

'Other' Category

- 29 votes: PARKING. Especially on pavements and around schools
- 13: Fly tipping and litter
- 11: Pony & trap racing on A413 (also highly represented in ASB in Denham, GX and Amersham CB)
- 6: Lack of visible Police presence
- 5: HGVs on weight limited roads
- 4: Vehicle Noise, Dog Fouling
- 3: Graffiti
- 2: Racism/hate crime, Wildlife crime
- 1: Pot holes, Rural theft, Street Lighting, Road rage, Public indecency, Illegally dumped vehicles

All comments will be passed on to appropriate area Sergeants, Community Board Chairs for whatever action may be possible/appropriate
