Survey Overload?

Community Safety Partnership

- Annual, run by Buckinghamshire Council for multi-agency partnership
- Covers Buckinghamshire
- Feeds 3-yearly strategy cycles, updated annually
- 1264 respondents Nov 2022
- 2023-2026 Priorities:
- 1) Neighbourhood crime
- 2) Anti-social behaviour
- 3) Serious violence
- 4) Violence against women and girls
- 5) Exploitation of vulnerable people


Police & Crime Commissioner

- Rolling
- Covers Thames Valley
- Includes perceptions of Police, feelings of safety, criminal justice system, funding
- >8,000 respondents, 1,532 in Bucks ex MK (to May 15th)
- N'hood Policing #1 in use of Council Tax funding
- Top 3 crimes identified as issues within respondents' areas:
- 1) Speeding, dangerous driving
- 2) Criminal damage, graffiti, flytipping
- 3) Drug dealing

Chiltern & S Bucks Policing Issues Forum

- 3x a year
- Covers 7 Community Boards, 6 Neighbourhood Policing areas
- Focussed on categories relevant to Neighbourhood Policing:
- "Would this realistically be a candidate to be included on the Neighbourhood Police officers' daily work schedules?"
- "Is this category already a national or Force priority?"
- 3) "Is action on this category primarily the responsibility of another body?"

Engagement is good, but MUST lead to Action




- Survey of residents to establish concerns that they would like to see as focus areas for TVP Neighbourhood Policing teams.
- Discussion and questions at meeting, including TVP reports on previous focus areas.
- Focus areas set, communicated to TVP Neighbourhood Teams, become part of their daily routine and reporting plans.
- Emphasis on speedy turnaround and transparency.

Engagement – July 2023 Survey


CSB Forum July 2023 Survey - engagement by CB Area



- Survey held from 1st to 23rd July 400 responses (582).
- Higher engagement in previous survey driven by strong local issues, in particular Burglary.
- Drops in all CBs bar Beaconsfield, greatest falls in Amersham (-59 respondents) and Denham GX and Chalfonts (-61).
- Population-adjusted engagement highest in Missendens.
- 33 responses from under 18s (44).
- Distributed via Neighbourhood Alerts, TVP Alerts, social media, direct mailing.


Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas July 2023 - All CB Areas



- Top 4 choices the same, and in the same order, as March/April survey, but this masks some significant changes.
- BURGLARY fell from 65% to 52%
- SPEEDING a clearer #2 from 36% to 44%, top in 3 of 4 CB areas
- DRUGS also up from 35% to 40%
- VEHICLE CRIME from 29% to 33% with main concern in S Bucks CBs

- Top 4 choices the same, and in the same order, as March/April survey, but this masks some significant changes.
- BURGLARY fell from 65% to 52%
- SPEEDING a clearer #2 from 36% to 44%, top in 3 of 7 CB areas
- DRUGS also up from 35% to 40%
- VEHICLE CRIME from 29% to 33% with main concern in S Bucks CBs


- **Burglary** concern top in all but one area.
- **Speeding** #1 in Missendens, #2 in Beaconsfield, Chesham, Wexham & Ivers.
- **Drugs** top 3 in 5 of 7 CB areas, and with Under 18s.
- Antisocial Behaviour likely to increase in summer months.

- **Burglary** concern top overall, and in 4 CB areas.
- **Speeding** now top in 3 of 7 CB areas.
- **Drugs** notably strong in town areas.
- Vehicle Crime relatively high in S Bucks areas.

How do Residents' Concerns match recorded Crime Types?




Survey share and % of crime (POLICE.UK)

- Crime data from POLICE.UK, showing share of recorded crime types across Chiltern & S Bucks over past 12 months.
- No data for Speeding and Rogue Traders and Scams, but the latter including online accounts for ~40% of crime nationally.
- Survey data for 'Theft from' and 'Theft of' Vehicles aggregated removing duplications.

Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas – Amersham


Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas July 2023 - Amersham



- 47 respondents, down from 106
- 70% nominated Burglary as a top 3 concern (from 84%)
- 34% Drugs
- 34% Violence & Sexual Offences
- 28% Speeding
- 28% Rogue Traders







Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas – Denham, GX Chalfonts


Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas July 2023 - Denham GX Chalfonts



- 93 respondents (from 155)
- 73% Burglary (from 75%)
- 37% Drugs (from 28%)
- 35% Theft of a Vehicle
- 31% Speeding (from 27%)
- 26% Antisocial Behaviour (46%)
- Continuing comments relating to Pony & Trap Racing, but with recognition of recent TVP efforts.

Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas – Missendens CB


Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas July 2023 - Missendens

- 64% Speeding (from 59%)

- 37% Burglary (48%)


Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas – Wexham & Iver CB


- 38 respondents (from 63)
- 53% Speeding (from 41%)
- 34% Burglary (48%)
- 34% Theft from a Vehicle (33%)
- 32% Drugs (33%)
- 26% Rogue Traders

Burglaries – January 2021 to May 2023




- Acute concerns at spike in Burglary numbers were certainly reflected in March/April survey
- Drop in share of latest survey less anxiety about burglaries, or greater anxiety elsewhere?
- Still >70% in Amersham and Denham, Gerrards Cross & Chalfonts
- 5 arrests made in March of group believed to be involved in GX spike in burglaries Nov 22-March 23.

Burglaries – longer term perspective



- Total burglaries 12-month moving average rising for the past 18 months.
- Recent peak November 2022

Drugs – a conundrum



- Continued strong perception that Drugs is a problem:
- Now a clear #3 at 40% of votes (35% in previous survey).
- Relatively low recorded crime: average of 14 per month across Chiltern & S Bucks last 12 months.
- Concern that Drugs promote further harms
- A 'focus area' for NHP since April. Neighbourhood Newsletters report on approach and actions.

Speeding

"Whilst speed enforcement is not principally owned by Neighbourhood Policing Team (Roads Policing owns road safety), we do play our part with the deployment of our own approved devices."



Antisocial Behaviour – the 'usual' seasonal pick up?



- Strong seasonal pattern increased ASB in summer months.
- A catch-all category.
- Steady in the survey at #4 and 33%.
- ASB complaints in Denham GX and Chalfonts often reference Pony & Trap Racing on A413

'Other' Category

PARKING. Especially on pavements and around schools Pony & trap racing on A413 Fly tipping and litter Lack of visible Police presence, want more direct engagement Underage drivers Aggressive, intimidating driving HGVs on weight limited roads Untaxed, no MOT or insurance vehicles Vehicle Noise eScooters Graffiti Wildlife crime Dog Fouling All comments are passed on to appropriate area Sergeants for whatever action may be possible/appropriate


