

Q: What is the benefit to Thames Valley Police of the Forum?









Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas – June 2024 Survey




- Significant increase in share of vote for BURGLARY: #1 in 5 of 6 Community Board areas.
- DRUGS now #2 (#4 Nov 23, #3 July 23, April 23)
- SPEEDING #3 (#2 Nov 23, July 23, April 23)
- VEHICLE THEFT in top 4 for 1st time
- Increased share for Rogue Traders and Scams

Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas - Nov 2023 Survey




November 23 survey for comparison.

Residents' Votes for NHP Focus Areas – last 4 surveys



- April 2023 and June 2024: coming off winter spikes in Burglary crime levels
- Shares on others somewhat suppressed by dominance of Burglary. Hence increases in Vehicle Crime and Rogue Traders/Scams stand out

Vehicle Crime votes, adjusted



- Methodology: 'Vehicle Crime' includes all votes for 'Theft from a Vehicle' and 'Theft of a Vehicle', but where a respondent has voted for both, it is counted as one vote, not two.
- On this basis, serious acquisitive theft (Burglary, Vehicles) is an even more dominant theme of the survey.



- **Burglary** concern top overall, and in 5 of 6 CB areas.
- **Drugs** top 3 in just 2 CBs but score consistently enough across the area to be #2 overall
- **Speeding** #3 overall, #1 in 8th consecutive survey in Missendens.
- **ASB** less prominent, **Vehicle Crime** more prominent.








Votes – Beeches Community Board




Votes - Chesham & Villages Community Board







Votes – Denham, GX and Chalfonts Community Board








Burglaries – January 2022 to April 2024





- Increasing trend, with increased winter spikes.
 Unsurprising that this is reflected in sharply higher vote share in latest survey.
- #1 concern in 5 of 6 CB areas
- Various crime initiatives aimed at proactive prevention eg Operation Grotto Winter 2023

Burglaries – Jan 2022 to April 2024 by Policing Neighbourhood




Burglaries – longer term perspective





- Yes, it's true. Burglary and theft numbers have been on a secular downturn for the past 30 years
- But this is cold comfort to those who experience a rising trend in the here and now

Drugs – low reported crime stats but...



- Continued strong perception that Drugs is a problem:
- #2 at 34% of votes.
- Relatively low recorded crime: average of 16.5 per month across Chiltern & S Bucks last 12 months.
- Concern that Drugs promote further harms
- A 'focus area' for NHP since April 2023. Neighbourhood Newsletters report on approach and actions.

Speeding

"Whilst speed enforcement is not principally owned by Neighbourhood Policing Team (Roads Policing owns road safety), we do play our part with the deployment of our own approved devices." from Chesham Neighbourhood Policing newsletter, March 2023



Antisocial Behaviour - the 'usual' seasonal pattern?



- Strong seasonal pattern increased ASB in summer months.
- A catch-all category.
- #5 and 28% in latest survey (#3 and 42% Nov 2023).
- ASB and Other complaints in Denham GX and Chalfonts often reference A413 Pony & Trap Racing

'Other' Category

Two dominant themes:

ROADS AND VEHICLES

PARKING

Bad Driving

Untaxed, no MOT, insurance vehicles

PONY & TRAP RACING (Denham, Gerrards Cross and Chalfonts)

Others:

Major fire (pollution concerns) on development site at Holmer Green

Rural Crime

Intimidation, Rowdiness, Noise


Prostitution, Modern Slavery

Forum Website – greater focus on community resilience




THE WORLD THE PARTY TO THE
